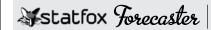

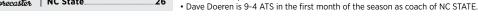

ARIZONA CARDINALS

Regular Season Wins Prop: OVER 8 (-155) / UNDER 8 (+125)

OFFENSE: This could end up being QB Carson Palmer's final chance to reach his first Super Bowl, as he'll be 38 by the time the season ends. The focal point of the offense will again be RB David Johnson, who led the NFL with 20 touchdowns and 2,118 yards from scrimmage in 2016. WR Larry Fitzgerald led the NFL in receptions as a 33-year-old last season, but he's now far more of a possession receiver than the big-play threat he was earlier in his career. DEFENSE: After having fielded the NFL's second-ranked defense a year ago, Arizona lost DE Calais Campbell, LB Kevin Minter and S Tony Jefferson to free agency. Patrick Peterson remains one the NFL's best shut-down corners, and the edge-rushing combo of Chandler Jones and Markus Golden is back after having led the Cards to an NFL-best 48 sacks in 2016. DB Tyrann Mathieu struggled in '16 after coming off the previous season's ACL tear. BOTTOM LINE: If Palmer and Mathieu stay healthy all season, the Cardinals have one of the league's most talented rosters. With two division foes rebuilding (49ers and Rams) and the AFC South on the schedule, nine wins seem well within reach for a coach as good as Bruce Arians. OVER 8



ATLANTA FALCONS

Regular Season Wins Prop: OVER 9½ (-125) / UNDER 9½ (-105)

OFFENSE: The Falcons lost the league's best offensive coordinator in Kyle Shanahan (now the 49ers' head coach). MVP QB Matt Ryan has arguably the league's best WR in Julio Jones, and Atlanta got great production from the rest of their receiving group when Jones drew copious defensive attention. Devonta Freeman and Tevin Coleman might be the NFL's best RB combo: Both are great receivers, patient runners and homerun threats in the open field. DEFENSE: Atlanta's defense improved greatly during the course of 2016. Edge-rusher Vic Beasley led the league in sacks, rookies LB Deion Jones and S Keanu Neal matured quickly, CB Robert Alford established himself as a bona fide No. 1 CB and DT Grady Jarrett was simply dominant in the Super Bowl. Newly-acquired DT Dontari Poe is a space-eating run-stuffer, and elite CB Desmond Trufant is back after missing ten games with a shoulder injury. BOTTOM LINE: Atlanta's offense is likely to slow down with Shanahan gone and Ryan playing over his head last year. An argument could be made for the NFC South being the league's best division from top to bottom, and only twice in 15 seasons has a team repeated as division champs. UNDER 91/2



BALTIMORE RAVENS

Regular Season Wins Prop: OVER 9 (EVEN) / UNDER 9 (-130)

OFFENSE: Baltimore was the league's most pass-heavy team last season, and has indicated they'd like to run more often. The problem is that their options at RB are Terrance West and Buck Allen, with pass-catcher Danny Woodhead bound to see plenty of playing time. Off an up-and-down season, QB Joe Flacco needs third-year WR Breshad Perriman and newly-acquired, oft-injured WR Jeremy Maclin to become serious threats.

DEFENSE: Baltimore's defense boasted the league's second-best third-down conversion rate last season, and made significant upgrades to their secondary with the signings of S Tony Jefferson and CB Brandon Carr, along with first-round draft pick CB Marlon Humphrey. DT Brandon Williams is an elite run-stuffer, LB C.J. Mosley is as good in coverage as any linebacker and edge-rusher Terrell Suggs still has some gas left in the tank. **BOTTOM LINE:** During John Harbaugh's tenure, no team has played in as many close games as the Ravens, making their win total pick especially difficult

year in and year out. The defense should be great, but Flacco doesn't have enough weapons to reach double-digit wins. **UNDER 9**



BUFFALO BILLS

Regular Season Wins Prop: OVER 6 (-155) / UNDER 6 (+125)

OFFENSE: The Bills were the NFL's second most run-heavy team in 2016, and that's unlikely to change under new HC Sean McDermott. RB LeSean McCoy's 5.4 yards per rush in 2016 was tops among runners with 150+ carries,. QB Tyrod Taylor was stuck with a lackluster receiving group even before the August 11 trade of WR Sammy Watkins to the Rams. WR Anquan Boldin's August 20 retirement came less than two weeks after he'd signed with Buffalo.

DEFENSE: DTs Marcell Dareus and Kyle Williams have the talent to improve last year's awful run defense (29th in the NFL). Meanwhile, 2016's top two draft picks, DE Shaq Lawson and LB Reggie Ragland, are finally fully healthy, though Ragland is not an ideal fit in McDermott's 4-3 scheme. While departed CB Stephon Gilmore will be hard to replace, former Packers S Micah Hyde and first-round draft pick CB Tre'Davious White bolster the secondary.

BOTTOM LINE: The Bills have the toughest schedule of any non-AFC West team. McDermott has enough talent to win seven or eight games, but his biggest challenge will be cleaning up the mess that Rex Ryan's undisciplined, disorganized approach left behind. OVER 6



CAROLINA PANTHERS

Regular Season Wins Prop: OVER 8½ (-165) / UNDER 8½ (+135)

OFFENSE: Carolina moved away from the power running game that was so effective in 2015, using more three-wide formations and running QB Cam Newton far less often. The offense struggled: Newton regressed as a passer while receivers rarely created separation. First-round draft pick RB Christian Mc-Caffrey is effective as a power runner and a slot receiver, and second-rounder WR Curtis Samuel is also a moveable chess piece with run-after-catch ability. **DEFENSE:** New coordinator Steve Wilks, a Carolina assistant since 2012, won't be changing a thing about the Panthers' 4-3 scheme. LBs Luke Kuechly, Thomas Davis and Shaq Thompson are the most athletic and effective linebacking corps in the league, though Davis is bound to slow down at age 34. The defensive line was too inconsistent last year, and the Panthers' inexperienced secondary was asked to cover for too long on too many plays. **BOTTOM LINE:** The NFC South is shaping up to be a very competitive division, and a defense susceptible in the passing game will be a huge issue against the likes of Brees, Ryan and Winston. If Cam Newton plays like he did last season, Carolina isn't a playoff team. **UNDER 8**%



CHICAGO BEARS

Regular Season Wins Prop: OVER 5½ (+110) / UNDER 5½ (-140)

OFFENSE: Chicago's offense will center around RB Jordan Howard, who ran for 961 yards in his last nine games as a rookie. But opponents will stack the box against one of the league's weakest passing games. QB Mike Glennon was brought in to keep the seat warm for No. 2 overall draft pick Mitchell Trubisky. After losing WR Alshon Jeffery in free agency, Chicago is hoping 2015 first-round draft pick WR Kevin White is finally ready to contribute. **DEFENSE:** Coordinator Vic Fangio has the pieces in place to make Chicago's defense a strength. Veteran LBs Danny Trevathan and Jerrell Freeman anchor a solid front seven that has depth and talent on the edge. 2016 first-round pick Leonard Floyd showed flashes of pass-rushing dominance as a rookie, and free agent signing CB Prince Amukamara reinforces a secondary that was inconsistent and riddled by injuries last season.

BOTTOM LINE: With a talent-deficient, rebuilding offense, Chicago might not be a favorite until November (their first five home opponents are Atl, Pit, Min, Car and GB). They have the running game and defense to keep games close, but their passing game will be a disaster. **UNDER 5**%



CINCINNATI BENGALS

Regular Season Wins Prop: OVER 8½ (EVEN) / UNDER 8½ (-130)

OFFENSE: Cincinnati's offensive woes last season were a product of poor offensive line play, and they lost their two most reliable linemen (Andrew Whitworth and Kevin Zeitler) this offseason. Rookies RB Joe Mixon and WR John Ross are big-play threats, WR A.J. Green is a nightmare to defend and TE Tyler Eifert can dominate in the red-zone. While QB Andy Dalton is more of a game-manager than a playmaker, he has more weapons than ever.

DEFENSE: Longtime defensive line tandem DE Carlos Dunlap and DT Geno Atkins are monsters up front, each contributing over 50 career sacks for Cincy. LB Vontaze Burfict is productive when he stays out of trouble, and former Cardinals LB Kevin Minter is an upgrade in the middle of the defense. The secondary is lackluster, but has some depth at CB with former first-rounders Darqueze Dennard and William Jackson waiting in wings.

BOTTOM LINE: Cincinnati's stout defense gives them a chance to win every week, and Dalton has a lot of explosive options at his disposal. After winning 43 games from 2012 to 2015, last season looks more like an aberration than a new trend. **OVER 8**½



CLEVELAND BROWNS

Regular Season Wins Prop: OVER 4½ (-130) / UNDER 4½ (EVEN)

OFFENSE: Second-round draft pick QB DeShone Kizer has great tools, but he's going to be thrown into the fire before he's ready. His receiving group may be the NFL's worst, with WR Kenny Britt as the No. 1 option and 2016 first-rounder WR Corey Coleman looking woefully overmatched last season. RB Isaiah Crowell will be the early-down, between-the-tackles runner, while RB Duke Johnson will be a game-breaker on outside runs and short passes.

DEFENSE: Ranking 31st last season, Cleveland's defense has been stockpiling young talent. No. 1 overall draft pick Myles Garrett joins edge-rushers Emmauel Ogbah and Carl Nassib, who both showed promise as rookies last year. The Browns locked up productive LBs Jamie Collins and Christian Kirksey long-term, CB Joe Haden is still one of the league's better coverage men and hybrid rookie Jabrill Peppers is likely to play all over the formation.

BOTTOM LINE: With the possible exception of hosting the Jets in Week 5, Cleveland might not be a favorite this season. Though their coaching staff and young talent are trending up, a mediocre defense and an atrocious passing game will lead to another long season. UNDER 4½



DALLAS COWBOYS

Regular Season Wins Prop: OVER 9½ (-115) / UNDER 9½ (-115)

OFFENSE: With the NFL's best offensive line, life is easy for Dallas' skill position players. RB Ezekiel Elliott is a legit All-Pro talent, but he was given a six-game suspension to start the season. QB Dak Prescott showed advanced maturity and productivity as a rookie, but may need to be less of a game-manager in 2017. WR Dez Bryant and TE Jason Witten are still two of the best at their positions, but there isn't much receiving talent beyond them. **DEFENSE:** Dallas' defense ranked 1st against the run last year with All-Pro LB Sean Lee plugging the middle. They lost three key contributors from the scondary this offseason (S Barry Church and CBs Brandon Carr and Morris Claiborne), leading them to draft four DBs in April and sign backup-level free agents CB Nolan Carroll and S Robert Blanton. The pass-rush lacks star power but has depth, including first-round draft pick DE Taco Charlton. **BOTTOM LINE:** If Elliott can stay on the field once he returns from suspension, Dallas' offense will be very difficult to defend, even if Prescott takes a step back. The defense, which ranked 5th in points allowed a year ago, should be able to hold up well enough for ten wins. **OVER 9**%



DENVER BRONCOS

Regular Season Wins Prop: OVER 8½ (+125) / UNDER 8½ (-155)

OFFENSE: New coordinator Mike McCoy is a brilliant offensive mind who consistently squeezes production from under-talented units. Denver enters 2017 with nothing but question marks under center. First-round draft pick OT Garett Boles and free agents G Ronald Leary and OT Menelik Watson should improve a shaky o-line. RB C.J. Anderson will benefit from improved blocking, and RBs Devontae Booker and Jamaal Charles will also contribute. **DEFENSE:** The CB trio of Chris Harris, Aqib Talib and Bradley Roby is the league's best, as Denver held opponents to the fewest passing yards and the lowest QB Rating in the NFL last season. Edge-rusher Von Miller is a perennial All-Pro game-wrecker, and 2015 1st-rounder Shane Ray is proving a capable complement. The loss of masterful coordinator Wade Phillips creates a void, though new coordinator Joe Woods hopes to keep a similar system in place. **BOTTOM LINE:** The Broncos face the league's toughest schedule based on opponents' 2016 win percentages. The defense is championship-worthy, but offense is still in dire need of productive quarterback and running back play. Denver won't surpass Kansas City and Oakland until that happens. **UNDER 8**%



DETROIT LIONS

Regular Season Wins Prop: OVER 8 (+155) / UNDER 8 (-190)

OFFENSE: QB Matthew Stafford was playing at an MVP level before injuring his throwing hand in Week 14, leading Detroit to a record eight comeback victories. His supporting cast is mediocre, as WRs Marvin Jones and Golden Tate are better suited to ancillary roles and TE Eric Ebron is still a work in progress. RBs Ameer Abdullah and Zach Zenner are a lackluster pair of runners, though Theo Riddick is one the league's top pass-catching RBs.

DEFENSE: Detroit's defense struggled mightily against the pass, allowing the highest opponent QB Rating and recording the third-fewest sacks. DE Kerry Hyder performed well last season while DE Ziggy Ansah posted a career-low two sacks after amassing 30 in his first three seasons. The secondary and linebacking groups are also thin on production, though first-round draft pick LB Jarrad Davis could be a difference maker up the middle.

BOTTOM LINE: Playing in so many close games, the Lions looked like they were a few breaks from being a 5-11 team as opposed to a title contender. Stafford's career 5-46 versus winning teams is troubling, as is the dearth of talent on the roster outside the QB position. UNDER 8



GREEN BAY PACKERS

Regular Season Wins Prop: OVER 10 (-150) / UNDER 10 (+120)

OFFENSE: After a rocky start to the season, QB Aaron Rodgers hit his stride and the Packers averaged 32 points in eight-straight wins before Atlanta knocked them out of the playoffs. WR Jordy Nelson is nearly impossible to cover one-on-one, and Rodgers makes up for the lack of talent in the rest of his receiving group. RB Ty Montgomery impressed after moving from WR, but his durability is questionable and the Packers lack depth at RB.

DEFENSE: After giving up the most yards per pass in the league, the Packers lost versatile DB Micah Hyde to free agency. Two second-round picks, CB Kevin King and S Josh Jones, need to get up to speed quickly. Ha Ha Clinton-Dix and Morgan Burnett are a solid safety combo, Nick Perry and Clay Mathews are fearsome edge-rushers and DL Mike Daniels is a force up front. But if the Packers can't cover, they'll be forced into many shootouts.

BOTTOM LINE: For all their flaws, it's hard to bet against Aaron Rodgers' Packers. Arguably the most talented player in the league, Rodgers makes plays in so many ways, often in spite of his teammates. The defense should be just good enough for eleven wins. OVER 10



HOUSTON TEXANS

Regular Season Wins Prop: OVER 8½ (-125) / UNDER 8½ (-105)

OFFENSE: Houston's roster may be just a QB away from title contention. Rookie QB Deshaun Watson will be the starter before long, but is severely lacking experience in a pro-style offense. Stud WR DeAndre Hopkins never built a rapport with Brock Osweiler last season, and second-year WRs Will Fuller and Braxton Miller should have increased roles in 2017. (Fuller first needs to get healthy.) RB Lamar Miller would benefit from a quality passing game, though. DEFENSE: Even with DL J.J. Watt injured, the Texans gave up the fewest yards in the NFL last year. Their defensive front is stocked with pass-rushing talent, DE Jadeveon Clowney and LB Whitney Mercilus among them, and opponents have not yet found a solution to their blitzing schemes. The loss of top-tier CB A.J. Bouye is a concern, though 2015 first-rounder CB Kevin Johnson is returning from a broken foot that cost him most of 2016.

BOTTOM LINE: Playing in arguably the NFL's worst division is a plus, as is drawing the Browns, Rams and 49ers as non-division foes. Even with another season of shaky QB play, Houston has a good enough running game and the elite defense to win the AFC South. OVER 8½



INDIANAPOLIS COLTS

Regular Season Wins Prop: OVER 9 (+110) / UNDER 9 (-140)

OFFENSE: Former top overall pick QB Andrew Luck still holds on to the ball too long, and a shoulder injury could end up preventing him from being ready for Week 1. WR T.Y. Hilton led the NFL in receiving yards in 2016, but WR Donte Moncrief can't stay on the field and former first-rounder WR Phillip Dorsett is looking like a bust. RB Frank Gore could end up splitting time with rookie RB Marlon Mack. The young offensive line needs to take a step forward in 2017. **DEFENSE:** New general manager Chris Ballard went on a front-seven shopping spree in free agency, loading up on underachieving and underused talent (e.g. OLBs Jabaal Sheard, Barkevious Mingo and John Simon). Last year's 30th-ranked defense also added former Giants run-stuffer DT Johnathan Hankins. Indy drafted DBs in the first two rounds, playmaking S Malik Hooker and physical CB Quincy Wilson, who are tabbed for starting roles.

BOTTOM LINE: The Colts have the NFL's easiest schedule based on last year's winning percentages, but didn't make offensive upgrades and are relying on unproven defensive additions. If Luck gets injured holding the ball too long behind a shaky line, this becomes a four-win team. **UNDER 9**



JACKSONVILLE JAGUARS

Regular Season Wins Prop: OVER 6 (-165) / UNDER 6 (+135)

OFFENSE: No. 4 overall draft pick RB Leonard Fournette will be the focus of the Jags offense, and he has the size and speed to contend for a rushing title. RB T.J. Yeldon is a solid No. 2 option who will play in passing situations. QB Blake Bortes was a disaster last year, and he's been a turnover machine throughout his career (21 per season). He has a decent WR group in Allen Robinson, Allen Hurns and Margise Lee.

DEFENSE: For the second-straight year, the Jaguars were big spenders in free agency, adding top-tier defenders CB A.J. Bouye and DE Calais Campbell. CB Jalen Ramsey and DEs Dante Fowler and Yannick Ngakoue all impressed as rookies last season, and LB Telvin Smith might be the league's most athletic linebacker. On paper, this looks like one the NFL's best defenses, but Jacksonville has been a bottom-ten team in points allowed for five-straight years. **BOTTOM LINE:** It's difficult to bet on a team with a potentially atrocious QB situation, but perhaps Jacksonville can do what Houston has done in recent years: Win with defense while squeezing some production out of a solid running game and talented receivers. **OVER 6**



KANSAS CITY CHIEFS

Regular Season Wins Prop: OVER 9 (-125) / UNDER 9 (-105)

OFFENSE: K.C.'s offense is too complicated for QB Alex Smith to lose his job to No. 10 overall draft pick QB Patrick Mahomes just yet. The pick indicates that the Chiefs want more production and splash plays from under center, whereas Smith has been a conservative game-manager. WR Tyreek Hill is effective as a moving chess piece, while TE Travis Kelce was the league's most productive receiving tight end in 2016.

DEFENSE: No team created more turnovers than the Chiefs last season, and the All-Pro duo of S Eric Berry and CB Marcus Peters are scoring threats when on the field. Edge-rusher Justin Houston is healthy after two injury-plagued seasons, and has tallied an impressive 60 sacks in 69 career starts. Former first-rounder Dee Ford is coming into his own opposite Houston, while Tamba Hali gives K.C. a deep rotation of pass-rushers.

BOTTOM LINE: The Chiefs have the NFL's second toughest schedule, and the AFC West might be the league's best division. Yet HC Andy Reid finds a way to win more often than not, and rarely loses to bad teams (19-4 SU as a favorite in the past two years). **OVER 9**



LOS ANGELES CHARGERS

Regular Season Wins Prop: OVER 7½ (-135) / UNDER 7½ (+105)

OFFENSE: New HC Anthony Lynn implemented a creative and effective running game in Buffalo, and now has RB Melvin Gordon at his disposal. A subpar O-line was reinforced by rookies Forrest Lamp and Dan Feeney and free agent OT Russell Okung. Lamp is, however, out for the season. QB Philip Rivers is the maestro of the offense, and the healthy return of No. 1 WR Keenan Allen will benefit him greatly. Hunter Henry and Antonio Gates will also contribute. **DEFENSE:** DE Joey Bosa played like a superstar as a rookie last season, and is a legitimate Defensive Player of the Year candidate. Edge-rusher Melvin Ingram is also a potent blitzer, and the young LB tandem of Jatavis Brown and Denzel Perryman is promising. CBs Casey Hayward and Jason Verrett have a chance to be among the NFL's best cornerback duos if Verrett gets back to full speed after tearing his ACL last October.

BOTTOM LINE: San Diego has been disproportionately victimized by injuries in recent years, and on paper has a talented offense and an up-and-coming young defense. Playing in a tough division with a new coach in a new city might be too much for them to overcome. **UNDER 7**½



LOS ANGELES RAMS

Regular Season Wins Prop: OVER 5½ (-120) / UNDER 5½ (-110)

OFFENSE: QB Jared Goff's rookie season was a disaster, but help is on the way. New HC Sean McVey ran an excellently-designed offense in Washington, and L.A. made a huge upgrade at OT with the signing of longtime Bengal Andrew Whitworth. Goff now has talent to work with, as the Rams traded for Sammy Watkins and also signed Robert Woods this summer. RB Todd Gurley was a huge disappointment last season, but should bounce back in a big way. DEFENSE: New coordinator Wade Phillips, one of the all-time greats in that role, has a talented front seven to work with. All-Pro DL Aaron Donald is an aggressive gameplan-wrecker, and Robert Quinn is as quick as any edge-rusher. LB Alec Ogletree and hybrid DB/LB Mark Barron both cover a ton of ground, but need work on diagnosing and reacting to plays. The secondary is full of question marks beyond CB Trumaine Johnson.

BOTTOM LINE: The addition of Sammy Watkins will mean nothing if he can't stay healthy, but he makes this team significantly better when on the field. His presence takes pressure off of both Jared Goff and Todd Gurley. That should improve the offense, and this defense is already excellent. **OVER 5**½



MIAMI DOLPHINS

Regular Season Wins Prop: OVER 7½ (-125) / UNDER 7½ (-105)

OFFENSE: Despite HC Adam Gase's fondness for the passing game, RB Jay Ajayi was too productive last year to keep the ball out of his hands this season. QB Ryan Tannehill suffered a season-ending knee injury in early August, which prompted Miami to sign Jay Cutler. Newly acquired TE Julius Thomas gives Cutler a downfield weapon to go along with deep threat WR Kenny Stills, slot man Jarvis Landry and inconsistent-but-talented WR DeVante Parker. **DEFENSE:** Miami's defense ranked 29th overall and gave up the second most yards per carry last year. DT Ndamukong Suh is still a beast, and the LB corps should be improved with the addition of longtime Steeler Lawrence Timmons. Edge-rusher Cameron Wake can still bring pressure in a part-time role, and first-round draft pick Charles Harris is his new understudy.

BOTTOM LINE: Gase's offense could be explosive even with mediocre QB play. The defense has a long way to go before the Fins compete for the division title, but two of their AFC East rivals (the Jets and Bills) are bad enough to get Miami to .500. **OVER 7**½



MINNESOTA VIKINGS

Regular Season Wins Prop: OVER 8½ (-105) / UNDER 8½ (-125)

OFFENSE: No team had a more glaring weakness in one unit than the Vikings did at offensive line last season. Free agent OTs Riley Reiff and Mike Remmers are huge upgrades. QB Sam Bradford is an accurate-but-conservative passer, and while his WR group is weak, maybe improved blocking will allow him to make more big plays. Rookie RB Dalvin Cook is a special talent who should be the focal point of the offense before long.

DEFENSE: DEs Danielle Hunter, Everson Griffen and Brian Robison combined for 28 sacks last season on the league's 3rd ranked defense, while DTs Linval Joseph and Shariff Floyd are space-eaters in the run game. In the secondary, S Harrison Smith and CB Xavier Rhodes are among the top performers at their positions, the latter allowing a league-best 42% completion percentage and 39.2 QB Rating on passes thrown his way last year.

BOTTOM LINE: Minnesota has the easiest schedule of any NFC team, facing five non-playoff teams in their five non-divisional home games. With a championship-caliber defense and an improving offense, the Vikings should be playoff-bound. **OVER 8**½



NEW ENGLAND PATRIOTS

Regular Season Wins Prop: OVER 12½ (-130) / UNDER 12½ (EVEN)

OFFENSE: The genius of HC Bill Belichick and QB Tom Brady is their ability to change the gameplan week-to-week, anticipating their opponent's approach and exploiting weaknesses. The defending champions added weapons in WR Brandin Cooks, RBs Mike Gillislee and Rex Burkhead and TE Dwayne Allen, which should overcome the loss of WR Julian Edelman to a season-ending knee injury last Friday. Star TE Rob Gronkowski enters the year fully healthy. DEFENSE: New England's defense allowed the fewest points in the NFL last season, as the Patriots win more with scheme than with individual talent. CB Stephon Gilmore joins a solid secondary that rarely gives up big plays. While LB Dont'a Hightower is expected to fill a variety of roles after having primarily been an old-fashioned bruiser in the middle of the defense, DE Trey Flowers is the Patriots' main man up front with Rob Ninkovich having retired. BOTTOM LINE: Thirteen wins is a huge number, but the Patriots were 3-1 without the league's best player last year, and Brady's only loss was to a team they don't face in 2017 (Seattle). Never done improving, the Pats are still in a class far above the rest of the AFC. OVER 12½



NEW ORLEANS SAINTS

Regular Season Wins Prop: OVER 8 (-105) / UNDER 8 (-125)

OFFENSE: Though he's lost a little arm strength, QB Drew Brees is most prolific when working deep down the middle, where rookie WR Michael Thomas thrived last season. WR Willie Snead is a solid possession receiver, and free agent signee WR Ted Ginn will stretch the defense on deep routes. RBs Mark Ingram and Adrian Peterson will lead a power running attack, while Ingram and third-round draft pick Alvin Kamara are assets in the passing game. **DEFENSE:** The Saints' defense has been among the bottom five in points allowed for three-straight seasons. After allowing the second most yards per pass attempt last year, New Orleans drafted CB Marshon Lattimore and S Marcus Williams with their first two draft picks. DE Cameron Jordan was the lone bright spot on defense last season, and 2016 first-rounder DT Sheldon Rankins showed promise after returning from a broken leg.

BOTTOM LINE: It's easy to take Brees and this offense for granted because of their consistently elite production. The defense showed some signs of life late last season and plugged holes in the secondary. Even a mediocre performance on that side of the ball makes the Saints a playoff team. **OVER 8**



NEW YORK GIANTS

Regular Season Wins Prop: OVER 9 (-105) / UNDER 9 (-125)

OFFENSE: Coming off a down season, QB Eli Manning enters his fourth year in HC Ben McAdoo's West Coast spread system. WR Odell Beckham is unstoppable when his head is right, and WR Brandon Marshall and rookie TE Evan Engram are huge upgrades to his supporting cast who should relieve some defensive pressure. The running game is an afterthought, with a middling offensive line working in front of 2016 fifth-rounder RB Paul Perkins. **DEFENSE:** Coordinator Steve Spagnuolo's D held opponents to 15 points per game in the second half of last season. S Landon Collins is a playmaker whose coverage deficiencies are masked by the stellar CB combo of Janoris Jenkins and Dominique Rodgers-Cromartie. DT Damon "Snacks" Harrison is a run-stuffer while DE Olivier Vernon sets the edge on running plays as well as anyone, though he and DE Jason Pierre-Paul have little help on the pass-rush. **BOTTOM LINE:** Manning's play will determine the Giants' fate in 2017. He made too many mistakes under pressure last season, and he's still stuck behind a shaky O-line with little depth in his receiving group. .500 seems about right for a team heavy on defense and inconsistent on offense. **UNDER 9**



NEW YORK JETS

Regular Season Wins Prop: OVER 4½ (+160) / UNDER 4½ (-200)

OFFENSE: QB Josh McCown is a placeholder with an injury history, and QBs Bryce Petty and Christian Hackenberg are far from ready to contribute. The receiving group is a who's-who of players better suited for punt-gunner duties. RBs Bilal Powell and Matt Forte will both get plenty of touches if only to keep the clock moving on the 2017 Jets' season.

DEFENSE: DEs Muhammad Wilkerson and Leonard Williams, both former first-rounders, are capable of pressuring quarterbacks from anywhere in the formation. OLB Sheldon Richardson has elite talent, but can't seem to avoid negative headlines off the field. The Jets nabbed former Dallas CB Morris Claiborne to take over as their top coverage guy, and their first two draft picks, Jamal Adams and Marcus Maye, are expected to be starting safeties. **BOTTOM LINE:** It might be harsh to say that the Jets are trying to lose. Most of their players will be working hard and trying to win, but the front office seems to be eying the future and what they expect to be a great QB class in next year's draft. **UNDER 4**½



OAKLAND RAIDERS

Regular Season Wins Prop: OVER 10 (EVEN) / UNDER 10 (-130)

OFFENSE: QB Derek Carr was playing at a high level before breaking his leg in December. WR Amari Cooper is a special talent who sometimes disappears in the face of press coverage, creating opportunities for veteran possession WR Michael Crabtree. Free agent TE Jared Cook will add another dimension to the passing game. Three years removed from his last productive season, RB Marshawn Lynch is an enigma, though he'll be running behind a stellar O-line. **DEFENSE:** Defensive Player of the Year DE Khalil Mack is not only a lethal pass-rusher, but also an exceptional run-defender. He and OLB Bruce Irvin combined for 18 sacks and 11 forced fumbles last season, but Oakland got very little production from the rest of the front seven. The young secondary was problematic last season, though 2016 first-rounder S Karl Joseph showed promise and first-round draft pick CB Gareon Conley should contribute right away. **BOTTOM LINE:** After finishing over .500 for the first time in 14 years, Oakland risks slipping back in 2017. The AFC West will be very competitive, and late-season matchups with the Patriots (in Mexico), Giants and Cowboys may be too much to handle. **UNDER 10**



PHILADELPHIA EAGLES

Regular Season Wins Prop: OVER 8 (-140) / UNDER 8 (+110)

OFFENSE: Asked to do too much as a rookie, Carson Wentz looked the part of a franchise QB at times. His supporting cast is drastically improved with the addition of WRs Alshon Jeffery and Torrey Smith, and the O-line is solid when intact. Beefy RB LeGarrette Blount's power running can take some of the pressure of Wentz, while RBs Darren Sproles and rookie Donnel Pumphrey are dynamic after-the-catch playmakers in space.

DEFENSE: Coordinator Jim Schwartz's unit faded after a strong start to 2016. This offseason, the loaded defensive line added DT Timmy Jernigan, DE Chris Long and first-round draft pick DE Derek Barnett. S Malcolm Jenkins can stuff the run and hold his own in coverage, but cornerback is a huge area of concern for Philly after losing both starters from a problematic group last season. The hope is that the newly acquired Ronald Darby can help. **BOTTOM LINE:** HC Doug Pederson is getting the pieces in place, but Philly is in the midst of a multi-year rebuilding process. Wentz has plenty of room to grow, and the skill position players around him aren't great. It'll be tough to compete in the loaded NFC East. **UNDER 8**



PITTSBURGH STEELERS

Regular Season Wins Prop: OVER 10½ (-140) / UNDER 10½ (+110)

OFFENSE: QB Ben Roethlisberger gets the ball out quickly most of the time, with plenty of downfield bombs worked in. WR Antonio Brown remains the top receiver, and WR Martavis Bryant is back after having served a season-long suspension in 2016. RB Le'Veon Bell is a good enough pass-catcher to play WR, and his patient running style behind an effective offensive ine made the running game the focus of the Steelers' offense late last season. **DEFENSE:** The Steelers' front-seven isn't as imposing as it to be, as 38-year-old LB James Harrison led the team with just five sacks a season ago. OLB Bud Dupree has shown signs of becoming a solid pass-rusher, while ILB Ryan Shazier will take on a larger role following the departure of Lawrence Timmons to Miami via free agency. The hope is that S Sean Davis and CB Artie Burns, Pittsburgh's first two draft picks in 2016, both take steps forward this season. **BOTTOM LINE:** Roethlisberger has been awful on the road the past two seasons, posting a 81.8 QB Rating (compared to 109.3 at home). Pittsburgh is 11-9 in away games during that time. Home games against the Packers and Patriots give them little room for error in 2017. **UNDER 10**½



SAN FRANCISCO 49ERS

Regular Season Wins Prop: OVER 4½ (-160) / UNDER 4½ (+130)

OFFENSE: New HC Kyle Shanahan a genius play-designer, which should allow him to wring some production from his ragtag bunch of misfits. Journeyman QB Brian Hoyer is 16-15 as a starter, and is familiar with Shanahan's system (and prickly personality) from their time together in Cleveland. WR Pierre Garcon is the No. 1 target with track star WR Marquise Goodwin stretching the field. The rest of the skill position spots are up for grabs. **DEFENSE:** New coordinator Robert Saleh is a former Seattle assistant and will try to build a Seahawks-like system after the Niners finished last in yards and points allowed in 2016. Some pieces are already in place, including DT DeForest Buckner and OLB Ahmad Brooks, the team's co-leaders in sacks last season. First-round draft picks DE Solomon Thomas and LB Reuben Foster are ready to make an immediate impact, but the secondary looks awful. BOTTOM LINE: The Niners could easily be underdogs 14-plus times this season. Ownership gave Shanahan and new general manager John Lynch sixyear contracts, acknowledging that rebuilding the franchise is a long-term project. 2017 could get ugly. UNDER 41/2



SEATTLE SEAHAWKS

Regular Season Wins Prop: OVER 10½ (-115) / UNDER 10½ (-115)

OFFENSE: Seattle has a flimsy O-line, but enough skill-position talent to overcome it. QB Russell Wilson has developed solid in-the-pocket skills in a spread passing attack, while maintaining his ability to improvise on the move. WR Doug Baldwin can beat defenders in a number of ways, while TE Jimmy Graham still causes matchup problems. RB Thomas Rawls is violent runner, while change-of-pace RB C.J. Prosise looked great in limited action as a rookie. DEFENSE: The Seahawks gave up the third fewest points and the lowest yards per carry average in the league last season. The Legion of Boom secondary lost a step, as CB Richard Sherman looked less dominant and safeties Earl Thomas and Kam Chancellor battled injuries. Up front, DE Michael Bennett is an underappreciated superstar while LBs Bobby Wagner and K.J. Wright are textbook examples of what a NFL coaches want from linebackers. BOTTOM LINE: Offseason attempts to trade Sherman may be a sign that the window is closing on Seattle's run of dominant defense. Road games against the Packers, Titans, Giants and Cowboys negate the advantage of playing in a division with two rebuilding teams. UNDER 101/2



TAMPA BAY BUCCANEERS

Regular Season Wins Prop: OVER 8½ (-130) / UNDER 8½ (EVEN)

OFFENSE: QB Jameis Winston is developing nicely under HC Dirk Koetter, reading the field at an advanced level for a young passer. Strong-handed WR Mike Evans led the league in targets last year, and Tampa added deep threat WR DeSean Jackson and first-round draft pick TE O.J. Howard this spring, RB Doug Martin will lead the power running game when his suspension ends in Week 4, with RBs Jacquizz Rodgers and Peyton Barber likely to fill in. DEFENSE: Tampa's defense improved greatly over the course of last season, allowing just 17.1 points per game in the second half of the year. CB Vernon Hargreaves and DE Noah Spence showed great promise and development as rookies, while veterans CB Brent Grimes and DT Gerald McCoy played at a high level. LBs Lavonte David and Kwon Alexander enjoyed a productive season as the Bucs were the best third-down defense in the NFL BOTTOM LINE: The Bucs are a popular playoff pick after winning six of their last eight games. The NFC South will be hotly contested, and non-division matchups against the Bears, Bills and Jets should help. If Winston continues to improve, Tampa Bay is a playoff team. OVER 81/2



TENNESSEE TITANS

Regular Season Wins Prop: OVER 8½ (-155) / UNDER 8½ (+125)

OFFENSE: HC Mike Mularkey's smash-mouth running game worked wonders last season, thanks to the excellent blocking of OTs Taylor Lewan and Jack Conklin. RBs DeMarco Murray and Derrick Henry will continue to grind behind a solid, young O-line. QB Marcus Mariota's quick release, accuracy and improving field-reading skills are promising, and Tennessee figures to limit his running after both of his pro seasons ended with leg injuries. **DEFENSE:** Coordinator Dick LeBeau worked his magic in his first year with Tennessee, and the Titans were the 2nd-ranked run defense in 2016. Massivebut-quick DT Jurrell Casey is a playmaker up front, while the OLB combo of Brian Orakpo and Derrick Morgan combined for 19.5 sacks. The secondary was a major weakness last season, so the Titans drafted CB Adoree' Jackson in the first round after signing CB Logan Ryan and S Johnathan Cyprien. BOTTOM LINE: The Titans are a trendy playoff pick, and facing playoff teams in four of their first five games (Oak, Sea, at Hou, at Mia) will put their merit to the test. The AFC South is ripe for the taking, and Tennessee looks like the division's most complete team. OVER 8½



WASHINGTON REDSKINS

Regular Season Wins Prop: OVER 7½ (-125) / UNDER 7½ (-105)

OFFENSE: HC Jay Gruden gets the most out of his offense, leaving the franchise to wonder if QB Kirk Cousins is the long-term starter or just a guy who benefits from fantastic play-designs. Jordan Reed is the best TE in the NFC and a matchup nightmare, and the rebuilt WR group of Terrelle Pryor, Jamison Crowder and Josh Doctson is promising. RBs Rob Kelley and rookie Samaje Perine will share touches in Washington's effective run game. **DEFENSE:** After two-straight seasons as a bottom-five defense, new coordinator Greg Manusky is installing an aggressive, physical scheme. OLB Ryan Kerrigan is the top pass-rusher, but his counterpart Trent Murphy will miss four games with a PED suspension. The defensive line may consist entirely of new starters, including first-round draft pick DE Jonathan Allen, and the secondary needs to improve after adding former Cardinals S.D.J. Swearinger.
